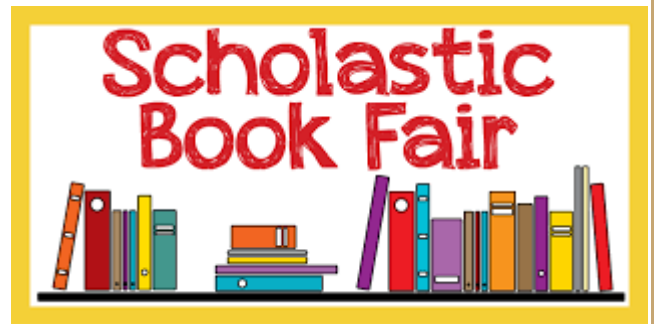


## Scholastic Book Fair Monday 18<sup>th</sup> – Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March

## British Science Week

Today marks the start of British Science Week until 17th March.

The theme this year is 'Time!'

The children are asked to take part in a poster competition, to be completed at home. They could create a poster showing how a certain type of technology has changed over time, or even the advancement of time-telling technology itself. Budding poster makers could also go futuristic, show us how they think the world might look in years to come, or perhaps look at nature – lifecycles, lifespans, evolution and hibernation – nature is full of timely topics.



British Science Week 2024 marks the Week's 30th anniversary. Children could think about scientific innovations since then, or explore 1994 itself – what was life like 30 years ago?

Entries must be submitted on an A4 or A3 piece of paper.

Competition closes on Monday 25th March. Children should give their poster entries to their class teacher.

The best 5 entries from Townfield will receive a chocolate prize and will be submitted into the official competition.

We have had some requests for advice on pupils taking the above exams. Staff at school are not in a position to comment on whether they believe a child may or may not be suitable candidates. We can provide a teacher assessment of whether your child is working below/ at/ above the 'expected level' for their age. We assess the content of the national curriculum and the 11+ content is different to this. Secondary school websites are the best place to find out more about entry requirements. Staff are unable to recommend tutors and school does not provide an 11+ club.

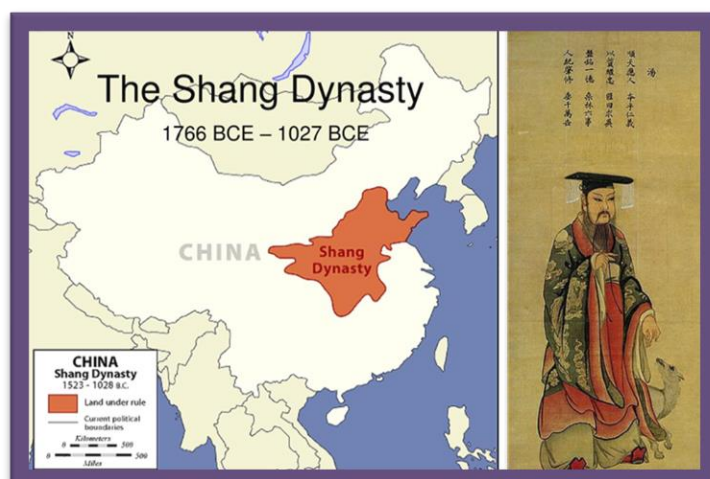




## Year 3 Shang Dynasty Workshop 26<sup>th</sup> April

On Friday, 26th April 2024, Year 3 will be taking part in a Shang Dynasty Workshop. This is an exciting opportunity for the children that will complement what they will be learning that term in their History topic, The Shang Dynasty.

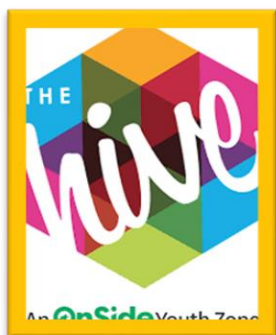
The workshop will bring the Shang Dynasty to life for the children through an engaging and participatory drama workshop where they will explore the rich history of the time through role play, performance and creativity.



Through engaging drama activities, the children will develop their understanding of this ancient civilisation, exploring how people lived, worshipped and farmed during the time. They will spend time learning about Fu Hao and her importance to our understanding of the Shang Dynasty and have the opportunity to explore the different classes of people who made up society at the time. This promises to be an enjoyable and memorable learning experience for all.

### Have you heard about The Hive?



The Hive is Wirral's Youth Zone, a state-of-the-art space designed with young people, for young people as a safe, inclusive place to try something new and have fun. With a climbing wall, gym, boxing ring, dance studio, salon, art room, music and media studios, a sports hall, rooftop kick pitch, skate park and training kitchen, there are more than 20 activities on offer every session - and a cafe to recharge when young people are ready for a break! It's £5 for annual membership (though if it's your first membership, you get it free with the code MEMBERFREE24!) and just 50p every time you visit. Young people can come down to The Hive from the age of 8, and keep coming until they're 19 (25 if your child has a disability or additional need).

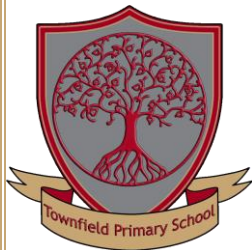

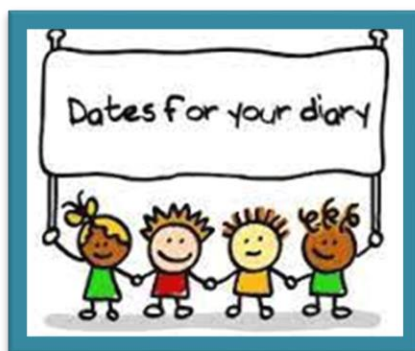
