
At the Rainbow Education Multi Academy Trust every child matters. We have worked together to ensure our schools meet the needs of all of our pupils and that all children reach their full potential.

Moderate Learning Difficulties (MLD) can be identified and diagnosed by an Educational Psychologist. When a child has a diagnosis of MLD, it means that their learning potential is **significantly lower** than their peers.

Generally, this means that children with this diagnosis will struggle to learn and retain basic Maths and English skills when compared to their peers.

Children with MLD will need extra support so that they can access the curriculum and make progress.

Children with a diagnosis of MLD will require further support so that they can access a broad and balanced curriculum. Instructions may need to be short and clear so that children are able to understand what they need to do. Children will benefit from a wide range of resources to help them such as concrete resources and pictorial resources. Children will also require scaffolded work and extra adult support.


